SCHEDULE FOOTNOTES – Read these notes for important information regarding the Fall 2014 schedule.

- 1 – Fall classes end on Tuesday, November 18. The College of Law will operate a **MONDAY** class schedule on Tuesday, November 18 to make up the Veteran's Day Holiday. The make-up day for Labor Day will be Monday, November 17.
- 3 – Students must take Business Organizations no later than the term in which they expect to graduate. Business Organizations will be offered in both day and evening sections in Spring 2015.
- 4 – Second year full-time students must take Constitutional Law II, Evidence and Professional Responsibility in Fall 2014.
- 5 – Second year full-time students must take Criminal Law in either the Fall Semester or Spring Semester of the 2014-2015 academic year.
- 6 – Course satisfies the Mission-Related Course requirement. Students must satisfy this requirement prior to graduation
- 8 – Completion of the following courses is highly recommended before enrolling in Florida Bar Law & Skills: Estates and Trusts, Family Law, and Florida Constitutional Law.
- 9 – Evidence is the prerequisite for Trial Practice.
- 10 – ONLY Seminars and Independent Research Projects satisfy the Upper-Level Writing Requirement.
- 11 – Students may not withdraw from clinics after the end of the Add/Drop period.
- 12 – Students enrolling in a clinic must attend a mandatory orientation on August 11, 2014 at 8:00 am & 5:00 pm in the Clinic Conference Room (Rm. 184). Meeting days and times for clinics other than Homelessness & Legal Advocacy will be determined at the orientation meeting.
- 13- Registration by application and permission ONLY. To register, students must complete two steps. First, the student must submit an approved outline and application signed by the Professor who will supervise and evaluate the research paper. Second, students must submit the signed applications to the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs for final approval. The supervising faculty member must be a member of the full-time faculty who does not teach in the Legal Methods Program or in the Academic Success and Bar Preparation Program.
