SCHEDULE FOOTNOTES – Read these notes for important information regarding the Spring 2017 schedule.

- 1 – Spring classes end on April 18, 2017. The College of Law will operate on a Monday Schedule on April 17, 2017 to make up the New Year Day observed on January 2. The College of Law will operate on Monday Schedule on April 18, 2017 to make up the Martin Luther King, Jr Day Holiday.
- 2 – Students must take Business Organizations no later than the term in which they expect to graduate.
- 3 – The Mission-Related Course requirement has been suspended until further notice.
- 4 – Enrollment in this course is limited to students who are eligible to graduate spring 2017, summer 2017 and fall 2017.
- 5 – Evidence is the prerequisite for Trial Practice
- 6 – ONLY Seminars and Independent Research Projects satisfy the Upper-Level Writing Requirement.
- 7 – Students may not withdraw from clinics after the end of the Add/Drop period..
- 8 – Students enrolling in a clinic must attend a mandatory orientation on **TBA** at 8:00 am & 5:00 pm in the Clinic Conference Room (Rm. 184). Meeting days and times for clinics other than Homelessness & Legal Advocacy will be determined at the orientation meeting.
- 9 - Registration by application and permission ONLY. To register, students must complete two steps. First, the student must submit an approved outline and application signed by the Professor who will supervise and evaluate the research paper. Second, students must submit the signed applications to the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs for final approval. The supervising faculty member must be a member of the full-time faculty who does not teach in the Legal Methods Program or in the Academic Success and Bar Preparation Program. Please see the College of Law website for a list of faculty members. Obtain the application from the Registrar's Office or from the College of Law website. The completed application MUST be submitted to the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs no later than the close of business on January 6, 2017. **LATE APPLICATIONS WILL NOT BE APPROVED.**
- 10 - This seminar requires the consent of the instructor along with a recommended prerequisite of having taken Advanced Torts: Dignitary and Economic Harms or Advanced Topics in Law: Defamation and Privacy. Students taking this seminar should come into the seminar with a solid understanding of the common law and constitutional rules governing defamation law.
- 11 – Moot Court and Trial Team are open only to students representing the College of Law on teams competing in state, regional or national competitions.
- 12 – Highly recommended academic skills course for all upper-level students. This class meets weekly beginning Thursday, January 19, 2017.
