

Upper-Level Writing Requirement Information

As a requisite for graduation, all students must satisfy the Upper-Level Writing Requirement. Students may satisfy the Upper-Level Writing Requirement as a part of a two (2) credit seminar, an approved advanced drafting course, an approved two (2) credit independent research paper, or through a note written by a FAMU Law Review member. Courses approved for satisfaction of the Upper-Level Writing Requirement must earn a grade of B- or above and must meet the minimum standards outlined below. The faculty certification must be approved in the semester the grade is recorded for courses satisfying the upper-level writing requirement.

Seminar Paper or Independent Research Paper

The research paper must be a minimum of 25 pages in length including footnotes, and the paper must meet all the standards listed on the Upper-Level Writing Requirement certification form.

Advanced Drafting Course

Advanced drafting courses that satisfy this requirement fall in the following categories: transactional legal drafting, litigation-oriented legal drafting, legislative drafting, and appellate legal drafting. Practice-oriented writing courses can be used to satisfy the Upper-Level Writing Requirement only if the faculty member teaching the course agrees in advance to require the following:

- 25 pages minimum of qualifying written work
- The written work must
 - * involve legal analysis;
 - * involve individual/original thought and drafting;
 - * be subjected to instructor review and student revision;
 - * have proper writing style for the legal context; and
 - * use proper legal citation form for the legal context.

Students in these courses may elect to have their credit fulfill either a portion of the Experiential Learning Requirement or the Upper-Level Writing Requirement, but not both. Courses approved for satisfaction of the Upper-level Writing Requirement must meet all the standards listed on the Upper-Level Writing certification form.

Law Review Note

Law Review notes meeting the standards satisfy the Upper-Level Writing Requirement. The certification may be given by either the Law Review faculty advisor or, preferably, a faculty member with expertise in the area of the student's writing. Law Review members should identify and confirm the faculty member that will certify their note as early in the process as possible.

The Upper-Level Writing Requirement may not be satisfied at any other institution under any circumstances.
