SCHEDULE FOOTNOTES – Read these notes for important information regarding the Fall 2015 schedule.

- 1 – Fall classes end on Tuesday, November 17. The College of Law will operate a *WEDNESDAY* class schedule on Tuesday, November 17 to make up the Veteran's Day Holiday. The make-up day for Labor Day will be Monday, November 16.
- 2 – Students **must** take Business Organizations no later than the term in which they expect to graduate. Business Organizations will be offered in both day and evening sections in Spring 2016.
- 3 – Second year full-time students must take Constitutional Law II, Evidence and Professional Responsibility in Fall 2015.
- 4 – Second year full-time students must take Criminal Law in either the Fall Semester or Spring Semester of the 2015-2016 academic year.
- 5 – Completion of the following courses is highly recommended before enrolling in Florida Bar Law & Skills: Wills and Estates, Family Law, and Florida Constitutional Law.
- 6 – Evidence is the prerequisite for Trial Practice.
- 7 – ONLY Seminars and Independent Research Projects satisfy the Upper-Level Writing Requirement.
- 8 – Students may not withdraw from clinics after the end of the Add/Drop period.
- 9 – Students enrolling in a clinic must attend a mandatory orientation on **TBA** at 8:00 am & 5:00 pm in the Clinic Conference Room (Rm. 184). Meeting days and times for clinics other than Homelessness & Legal Advocacy will be determined at the orientation meeting.
- 10 - Registration by application and permission ONLY. To register, students must complete two steps. First, the student must submit an approved outline and application signed by the Professor who will supervise and evaluate the research paper. Second, students must submit the signed applications to the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs for final approval. The supervising faculty member must be a member of the full-time faculty who does not teach in the Legal Methods Program or in the Academic Success and Bar Preparation Program. Please see the College of Law website for a list of faculty members. Obtain the application from the Registrar's Office or from the College of Law website. The completed application **MUST** be submitted to the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs no later than the close of business on August 10, 2015. **LATE APPLICATIONS WILL NOT BE APPROVED.**
- 11 – Moot Court and Trial Team are open only to students representing the College of Law on teams competing in state, regional or national competitions.
- 12 – Highly recommended academic skills course for all upper-level students. **TBA.**
