SCHEDULE FOOTNOTES -Read these notes for important information regarding the FALL 2019 schedule.

- 1 – Fall classes end on November 27, 2019. November 27th, 2019 is a designated inclement weather day to be used as needed. The make-up day for Labor Day is November 25th, 2019 (the COL will operate a Monday schedule). The make-up day for Veterans Day is November 26th, 2019 (the COL will operate a Monday schedule).
- 2 – Second year part-time students must take Constitutional Law I, Property I and Torts I in Fall 2019.
- 3 – Upper-Level year students must take Evidence if not already satisfied.
- 4 – Completion of the following courses is highly recommended before enrolling in Florida Bar Law & Skills: Wills and Estates, Family Law, and Florida Constitutional Law, Trusts and Fiduciary Administration.
- 5 – Evidence is the prerequisite for Trial Practice.
- 6 – ONLY (2) credits Seminars and Independent Research Projects satisfy the Upper-Level Writing Requirement.
- 7 – Students may not withdraw from clinics and field Placement after the end of the Add/Drop period.
- 8 – Students enrolling in a clinic must attend a mandatory orientation on **TBD** at 8:00 am & 5:00 pm in the Clinic Conference Room (Rm. 184).
- 9 - Obtain the Field Placement application from the College of Law website. The completed application must be submitted to the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs no later than the close of business on August 23, 2019. **LATE APPLICATIONS WILL NOT BE APPROVED.** To avoid a late registration fee, you must be registered for at least one class before the first day of classes August 19, 2019. Note: If all of your classes are dropped for any reason the late registration fee will be assessed when you re-register. Field Placements, Independent Research, Research Associate, Directed Individualized Study forms must be fully completed and submitted with all approvals on or before the First day of Add/Drop (August 19, 2019). Late Registration is a designated time frame (same dates as add/drop) for students who did not register for at least one class or all classes were dropped (no matter the reason) during the priority registration or open enrollment period. A late registration fee (100.00) will be assessed to late registrants.
- 10 - Registration by application and permission ONLY. To register, students must complete two steps. First, the student must submit an approved outline and application signed by the Professor who will supervise and evaluate the research paper. Second, students must submit the signed applications to the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs for final approval. The supervising faculty member must be a member of the full-time faculty. Please see the College of Law website for a list of faculty members. Obtain the application from the Registrar's Office or from the College of Law website. The completed application MUST be submitted to the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs no later than the close of business on August 23, 2019. **LATE APPLICATIONS WILL NOT BE APPROVED.**
- 11 – Moot Court and Trial Team are open only to students representing the College of Law on teams competing in state, regional or national competitions.
- 12– **Highly recommended academic skills course for all upper-level students:** Advanced Analytical Skills I. This class meets weekly beginning **TBD**.
- 13– **Highly Recommended Core Electives in Bar Examination Subject Areas:** Criminal Procedure: Pre-Trial, Wills and Estates, Florida Bar Law and Skills, Florida Constitutional Law, Florida Practice, Multistate Bar Law and Skills, Juvenile Law.
- 14– **Courses designated Experiential Courses are:** Interviewing, Counseling and Negotiation, Law Office Management, Domestic Violence Workshop, Criminal Defense Clinic, Field Placement, Guardian Ad Litem Clinic, Mediation Clinic.
