SCHEDULE FOOTNOTES -Read these notes for important information regarding the FALL 2020 schedule.

- 1 – Fall classes end on November 17, 2020. November 18-20 are designated inclement weather days to be used as needed. The make-up day for Labor Day is November 16, 2020 (the COL will operate a Monday schedule). The make-up day for Veterans Day is November 17, 2020 (the COL will operate a Monday schedule).
- 2 – Second year full-time students must take Constitutional Law II and Evidence in Fall 2020.
- 3 – Professional Responsibility is a required prerequisite for Field Placements and Clinics.
- 4– **Highly Recommended Core Electives in Bar Examination Subject Areas:** Florida Bar Law and Skills, Florida Practice, Multistate Bar Law and Skills, Payment Systems, Secured Transactions, Wills & Estates, Sales, Advanced Torts: Dignitary And Economic Harms, and Real Estate Law.
- 5 – Completion of the following courses is highly recommended before enrolling in Florida Bar Law & Skills: Wills and Estates, Family Law, and Florida Constitutional Law, Trusts and Fiduciary Administration.
- 6 – Evidence is the prerequisite for Trial Practice.
- 7– Two (2)- credit Seminars and Independent Research Projects satisfy the Upper-Level Writing Requirement.
- 8 – **Courses designated Experiential Courses are:** Interviewing, Counseling and Negotiation, Contracts, Criminal Defense Clinic, Field Placement, Guardian Ad Litem Clinic, Contract Drafting, Advanced Topics in Law A : Asylum Law, Mediation Clinic .
- 9 – Drafting courses may satisfy either the Experiential Learning requirement or the Upper-Level Writing requirements, but not both.
- 10 – Students may not withdraw from clinics and field placement after the end of the Add/Drop period.
- 11 – Students enrolling in a clinic and field placement must attend a mandatory orientation on **TBD** at 8:00 am & 5:00 pm in the Clinic Conference Room (Rm. 184).
- 12 - Obtain the Field Placement application from the College of Law website. The completed application must be submitted to the Associate Dean no later than the close of business on August 14, 2020. **LATE APPLICATIONS WILL NOT BE APPROVED**. To avoid a late registration fee, you must be registered for at least one class before the first day of classes August 9, 2020. Note: If all of your classes are dropped for any reason the late registration fee will be assessed when you re-register.
- 13 - Field Placements, Independent Research, Research Associate, Directed Individualized Study forms must be fully completed and submitted with all approvals on or before the First day of Add/Drop (**August 10, 2020**). Late Registration is a designated time frame (same dates as add/drop) for students who did not register for at least one class or all classes were dropped (no matter the reason) during the priority registration or open enrollment period. A late registration fee (100.00) will be assessed to late registrants.
- 14 - Registration by application and permission ONLY. To register, students must complete two steps. First, the student must submit an approved outline and application signed by the Professor who will supervise and evaluate the research paper. Second, students must submit the signed applications to the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs for final approval. The supervising faculty member must be a member of the full-time faculty. Please see the College of Law website for a list of faculty members. Obtain the application from the Registrar's Office or from the College of Law website. The completed application MUST be submitted to the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs no later than the close of business on August 14, 2020. **LATE APPLICATIONS WILL NOT BE APPROVED**.
- 15 – Moot Court and Trial Team are open only to students representing the College of Law on teams competing in state, regional or national competitions.
- 16– **Highly recommended academic skills course for all upper-level students:** Advanced Analytical Skills I. This class meets weekly beginning **TBD**.
- 17– Course coverage includes in-depth coverage of defamation, privacy, and misrepresentation.
