**SCHEDULE FOOTNOTES -Read these notes for important information regarding the FALL 2020 schedule.**

<p><b>1</b> – Fall classes end on November 17, 2020. November 18-20 are designated inclement weather days to be used as needed. The make-up day for Labor Day is November 16, 2020 (the COL will operate a Monday schedule on that day). The make-up day for Veteran's Day is November 17, 2020 (the COL will operate a Monday schedule on that day).</p>
<p><b>2</b> – Second year part-time students must take Constitutional Law I, Property and Torts in Fall 2020.</p>
<p><b>3</b> – Second year part-time students must take Evidence in Fall 2020.</p>
<p><b>4</b> – Part-time students must take Business Organizations no later than the third year.</p>
<p><b>5</b> – Completion of the following courses is highly recommended before enrolling in Florida Bar Law &amp; Skills: Wills and Estates, Family Law, and Florida Constitutional Law, Trusts and Fiduciary Administration.</p>
<p><b>6</b> – Evidence is the prerequisite for Trial Practice.</p>
<p><b>7</b> – Highly Recommended Core Electives in Bar Examination Subject Areas: Florida Bar Law and Skills, Florida Practice, Multistate Bar Law and Skills, Constitutional Law: First Amendment, and Advanced Torts: Dignitary And Economic Harms, Wills &amp; Estates.</p>
<p><b>8- Advanced Torts:</b> Course coverage includes in-depth coverage of defamation, privacy, and misrepresentation.</p>
<p><b>9</b>– Completion of the following courses is highly recommended before enrolling in Florida Bar Law &amp; Skills: Wills and Estates, Family Law, and Florida Constitutional Law, Trusts and Fiduciary Administration.</p>
<p><b>10</b>– Two (2)- credit Seminars and Independent Research Projects satisfy the Upper-Level Writing Requirement.</p>
<p><b>11 – Courses designated Experiential Courses are:</b> Interviewing, Counseling and Negotiation, Pretrial Workshop, Trial Practice, Criminal Defense Clinic, Field Placement, Guardian Ad Litem Clinic, Law Office Management.</p>
<p><b>12</b> - Obtain the Field Placement application from the College of Law website. The completed application must be submitted to the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs <u>no later than the close of business on August 14, 2020.</u> <b>LATE APPLICATIONS WILL NOT BE APPROVED.</b> To avoid a late registration fee, you must be registered for at least one class before the first day of classes August 9, 2020. Note: If all of your classes are dropped for any reason the late registration fee will be assessed when you re-register.</p>
<p><b>13</b> – Students may not withdraw from clinics and field Placement after the end of the Add/Drop period.</p>
<p><b>14</b> – Students enrolling in a clinic must attend a mandatory orientation on <b>TBD</b> at 8:00 am &amp; 5:00 pm in the Clinic Conference Room (Rm. 184).</p>
<p><b>15</b> – Field Placements, Independent Research, Research Associate, Directed Individualized Study forms must be fully completed and submitted with all approvals on or before the First day of Add/Drop (<b>August 10, 2020</b>). Late Registration is a designated time frame (same dates as add/drop) for students who did not register for at least one class or all classes were dropped (no matter the reason) during the priority registration or open enrollment period. A late registration fee (100.00) will be assessed to late registrants.</p>
<p><b>16</b> - Registration by application and permission ONLY. To register, students must complete two steps. First, the student must submit an approved outline and application signed by the Professor who will supervise and evaluate the research paper. Second, students must submit the signed applications to the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs for final approval. The supervising faculty member must be a member of the full-time faculty. Please see the College of Law website for a list of faculty members. Obtain the application from the Registrar's Office or from the College of Law website. The completed application MUST be submitted to the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs <u>no later than the close of business on August 14, 2020.</u> <b>LATE APPLICATIONS WILL NOT BE APPROVED.</b></p>
<p><b>17</b> – Moot Court and Trial Team are open only to students representing the College of Law on teams competing in state, regional or national competitions.</p>
<p><b>18</b>– <b>Highly recommended academic skills course for all upper-level students:</b> Advanced Analytical Skills I. This class meets weekly beginning <b>TBD</b>.</p>
