SCHEDULE FOOTNOTES -Read these notes for important information regarding the Spring 2021 schedule.

1 – Spring classes end on April 12, 2021. Holiday-College of Law closed in observance of Martin Luther King Day on January 18, 2021. The make-up day for Martin Luther King Day is April 12, 2021 (the COL will operate a Monday schedule).¶

2 – Second year part-time students must take Constitutional Law II and Evidence in the Spring 2021 semester.¶

3 – Upper-Level part-time students enroll in Evidence if not previously completed.

4 – Evidence is the prerequisite for Trial Practice and Advanced Trial Practice.¶

5 – Completion of the following courses is highly recommended before enrolling in Florida Bar Law & Skills: Wills and Estates, Family Law, Florida Constitutional Law, and Trusts and Fiduciary Administration.¶

6– ONLY seminars, independent research papers, approved advanced drafting courses, and notes written by a FAMU law review member accepted for publication in a co-curricular law school journal satisfy the Upper-Level Writing Requirement (ULWR). To satisfy the ULWR via a seminar, independent research paper, or advanced drafting course, the student must register for at least 2 credits.

7 – Accepted students are notified by e-mail. Once a student accepts an offer for a clinic position, the Registrar's Office will provide a registration permission number for course registration. Accepted clinic students are not permitted to drop the clinic course without approval of the Clinic Office. For any questions, please contact Professor Kim Crag-Chaderton. Students may not withdraw from clinics and field placement after the end of the Add/Drop period.

8 – Students enrolling in a clinic must attend a mandatory orientation on TBD at 8:00 am & 5:00 pm in the Clinic Conference Room (Rm. 184).

9 - The completed application must be submitted to the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs no later than the close of business on January 8, 2021. **LATE APPLICATIONS WILL NOT BE APPROVED.** To avoid a late registration fee, you must be registered for at least one class before the first day of classes January 4, 2021. Note: If all of your classes are dropped for any reason the late registration fee will be assessed when you re-register. Field Placements, Independent Research, Research Associate, **Teaching Fellow**, Directed Individualized Study forms must be fully completed and submitted with all approvals on or before the First day of Add/Drop (January 4, 2021). Late Registration is a designated time frame (same dates as add/drop) for students who did not register for at least one class or all classes were dropped (no matter the reason) during the priority registration or open enrollment period. A late registration fee (100.00) will be assessed to late registrants.

10 - Registration by application and permission ONLY. To register, students must complete two steps. First, the student must submit an approved outline and application signed by the Professor who will supervise and evaluate the research paper. Second, students must submit the signed applications to the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs for final approval. The supervising faculty member must be a member of the full-time faculty. Please see the College of Law website for a list of faculty members. Obtain the application from the Registrar's Office or from the College of Law website. The completed application **MUST** be submitted to the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs no later than the close of business on January 8, 2021. **LATE APPLICATIONS WILL NOT BE APPROVED.**

11 – Registration by application and permission ONLY. To register, students must complete two steps. First, the student must submit an application signed by the Professor who will supervise and evaluate the student's work. Second, students must submit the signed applications to the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs for final approval. The supervising faculty member must be a member of the full-time faculty. Please see the College of Law website for a list of faculty members. Obtain the application from the Registrar's Office or from the College of Law website. The completed application **MUST** be submitted to the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs no later than the close of business on January 8, 2021. **LATE APPLICATIONS WILL NOT BE APPROVED.**¶

12– **Moot Court and Trial Team** are open only to students representing the College of Law on teams competing in state, regional or national competitions. The names of the student representatives must be submitted by the faculty advisor before registration codes will be issued.¶

13– **Highly recommended academic skills course for all upper-level students:** Advanced Analytical Skills I. This class meets weekly beginning TBD.
